Per Article IV, Section 4, F, G and H of the TBHC by-laws:

F. Additional nominations may be made before February 10 by written petition to the secretary signed by five members and endorsed by each additional nominee, signifying that person's willingness to be a candidate. No person may be a candidate for more than one office. The additional nominations which are provided for herein may be made only from among those members who were not nominated by the nominating committee or who declined such nomination as above provided. However, no person who has declined the committee's nomination may be nominated by petition for the same position.



- G. As soon as possible after February 10 or at least two (2) weeks in advance of the annual meeting, the secretary shall notify each member of all such additional nominations and shall publish again the report of the nominating committee.


UK PERSPECTIVE ON THE BASSET

HEAD AND SKULL

- Domed with some stop
- Occipital bone prominent
- Medium width at brow tapering slightly to muzzle
- General appearance of foreface is LEAN not snipey



GOOD



POOR

- Top of muzzle nearly parallel with line from stop to occiput and not much longer than head fromstop to occiput
- There may be <u>a small amount</u> of wrinkle at brow and beside eyes. In any event skin of head supple enough as to wrinkle

<u>slightly</u> when drawn forward or when head is lowered.

THE HEAD

- As a rule dogs with shorter heads tend to have shorter necks and longer headed dogs will have long necks.
- Heads are especially important since they distinguish one breed from another.
- In some breeds great importance is put on head features over correct movement.
- REMEMBER THE BASSET WAS BRED FOR ENDURANCE.
- (A Golden Retriever for instance needs an adequate stop to see over the bird he is carrying during a retrieve.)
- Basset has moderate stop thereby his vision is somewhere in between.
- Basset has a lean foreface and a lack of cheek.
- Nostrils must be large and well opened in order to trap scent.

• N.B. Pale noses are prone to sunburn!
